GoH: Cat Faber[•] *by Peter Alway*



here are hundreds of glittering jewels in the night sky; each is really a blazing sun. But only 22 are of the first magnitude. If filk has even half that many first magnitude stars, Cat Faber is certainly among them. I know because most filkers can sing along with a few of her songs. In fact, at every filk gathering I attend – a convention, a house filk, or an online gathering, I inevitably hear a melody by Cat Faber. It may be a vintage Echo's Children song, or a more recent piece. Usually it's a cover, but often it's a parody using one of her memorable melodies. Consonance is fortunate to have Dr. Faber as a guest.

I was first introduced to Cat's music at a house filk in 2002, though I just knew them as "songs a local filker sang". I later learned that she chose her music because she was a sight-reader, and the Echo's Children songbook was a rare collection of proper filk sheet music. I learned later that Cat writes music with other singers in mind. She avoids wildly chromatic melodies and weird chords so that more people can sing her work.

I got to know Cat as a human being a few years later, in a carpool to Filkontario in 2007. One of the delights of my life was when she took the time to write lyrics for a tune that the lot of us were jamming on in the van. It's been my honor to collaborate with her on a few more songs, as she is a supreme lyricist. She is also a meticulously kind human being, taking care to treat people well, from the filk community to the patients at a low-income health care clinic where she volunteered for years. Those of us who are enjoying Lauren Oxford's music at Consonance can thank Cat for welcoming Lauren to our community and mentoring her.

Cat's songs cover big themes ("Hydrogen and Time" covers the history of the universe in just over a minute) and small ("True To A Sixteenth" is about the dimensional tolerances in canoe-building. Cat penned that in just 15 minutes.) She highlights women's accomplishments in a number of her songs. Another, "Goodnight Opportunity," will bring a tear to your eye over a real-life robot. Anyone who only knows her by her work with Echo's children is in for a real treat. I am especially fond of "Tree of Forgiveness" and "Tell Julia," songs as powerful as her older classics.

Cat's credentials are impeccable; she's won seven Pegasus Awards since 1995, and was inducted into the Filk Hall of Fame in 2023. Old-time filkers know her best from the four albums she made with Echo's Children from 1997 to 2004 but she wasn't done recording. She has released three CD's since then: her free-to-duplicate "I Promised Eli," and two more conventional albums, "The King's Lute" and "Dr. Faber's Medicine Show."

Cat's presence is a welcome highlight to this year's Consonance. Don't miss her concert!



Fan Fund Guest: Lauren Oxford

rom the moment Lauren Oxford entered the filk music scene, she commanded everyone's attention. Not loudly, not aggressively, but by quietly and gently emoting tremendous power and beauty in her crystal-clear voice and her creative chordings on an ever-growing assortment of stringed instruments. She has the polished ability to present each song so confidently that you can't tell if it's an original or a cover.

Lauren's gentleness was just our first introduction to her, of course. She soon proved how fiercely she could express herself in music by sharing songs so raw we can't help but listen and be drawn in to experience – and perhaps better understand - the complexities of being human. The purity of her voice cannot be ignored, and once she's got us, she makes us listen in awe to every glorious note, wonder at every innovative instrument tuning, and ponder the meaning of the universe through her lyrical mastery.

Lauren has deservedly received the Pegasus Award for Best Writer/Composer, been a standout participant at John McCutcheon's songwriting retreats, released her own self-titled debut album in 2022 (with a little help from a few of her talented friends), and plays as one-fourth of The Starlight Darlins band. She's also backed up many of her friends both on recordings and on stage, and her versatility as a vocalist and multi-instrumentalist makes any performance a notch (or two!) better. And amazingly, in the light of all this talent and success, Lauren remains humble, unassuming, and one of the kindest humans I know – whom I would also definitely want on my side in any fight moral, social, political, or otherwise.

Personally, I've been very pleased to be on stage with Lauren during concerts that were hers, mine, or others'. I will never forget an FKO where very late one night Lauren added banjo to one of my songs and I was nearly moved to tears at how well it sounded, and I knew this young person was someone to pay attention to. I am honored to be one of her adopted filk godmothers and to watch her grow as a songwriter and performer. Lauren is already one of our musical treasures; I can only imagine how tremendous she will be as time goes on, and I look forward to seeing that!

himsy and Wonder are twin planets in the heart of the galaxy of Peter Alway's music.

Whimsy is a world ruled by a hundred squirrels, all in a six-foot man suit. Its atmosphere is 60% giggles, 20% belly laughs, and 20% facepalms (approximate). We have received multiple transmissions from unicorns and hedgehogs performing extemporaneous absurdity, usually accompanied by a baritone ukulele.

Wonder is a world of spirals. Unearthly beauty illustrates its elegant equations. Microscopic beings live in the light of distant stars, and on the far shore there be dragons who guard the sorcery for mastering the air. It is from here that travelers begin their flights to places that humankind is still learning to see. In seeing them, I have learned more about being human.

The space around these planets rings with the voice of pure music. No words will carry here. Constellations make the shapes of stately dancers, and the moon sings lullabies. Once a year or so, if I am very lucky, I can hear the hymn of a dulcimer near Jupiter.

Peter arrived to the filk world in 2003, when his brother Dave guided his course to FKO and OVFF. He became an ambassador for Whimsy and Wonder and the stars beyond. He brings with him his telescopes and the maps that he has memorized, knowing that knowledge is one of the surest paths to wonder. He documents the details and histories of rockets of the world, compiling them with his meticulous drawings in books that set the standard for reference in model rocketry.

His affinity for teaching is near in magnitude to his love for music, but I have observed the bright center where music and friendship combine. It is because of Peter that I'm here. He knows that music, like knowledge, is best when shared. Just as astronomers wax rhapsodic about celestial mysteries, he finds joy in tending spheres of song through ever-expanding orbits.

It was because of Peter that when I walked into filk, it was straight to a front row seat at a Pegasus concert. I sat there and listened, and felt, and understood, and my life changed. Because Peter's special talent is revealing the wonders of the universe.

Open Filking

"Where and when can I Filk?"—the question that roams the halls of every convention, looking for an empty room...

After-hours filking will be in **Ballroom 2** and **Tactic 2.** Check the program grid at the end of this guide or your portable pocket program for times.

The hotel reserves the right to ask us to stop filking at any time after 1AM. Please refer to the Aloft Rules section at the end of the program book for more details.

Theme Circles

Hear and share songs with a designated theme – vampires, media, cyber, science, history. You name it, filkers will write songs about it. You may find a circle for songs with a particular mood – funny, bawdy, schmaltzy, or "ose." Any circle can be run in a particular style – chaos, bardic, poker-chip bardic, etc. This year's scheduled circles are listed in the program grid.

If you don't see a topic/style that hoists your sails, start your own theme circle! Go to the Info Desk, locate an open time slot & function room on the schedule, and write up an announcement including your name, theme, mood and style. However, these circles work like open filking, not a concert. You don't get to pick who performs!

Theme circles will be in **Tactic 2**.

Request Concert

As *inspired* by FilkCONtinental (okay, we stole the idea), there will be a request box at the info table, where you can request songs you would like to hear again. **Please write down both the song title and the performer.**

We will check the box Saturday evening and again Sunday morning and contact the performers you would like to hear.

Sign-up-and-Sing: 2xlOs

Want to showcase one or two special songs or get some practice performing on stage? Here's your chance to shine! Sign up for a 2×10 at the Registration table in the **Boardroom**. You get 10 minutes to set up, perform one long or two short songs, acknowledge the thunderous applause of the multitudes, and make a graceful exit. Microphones and plug-ins are provided, and the stage crew will help you get your act together. Keep it simple! Remember, your time includes setup and teardown.

OTHER ITEMS OF INTEREST

Interfilk/Consonance Auction

Keep those fabulous Interfilk Guests coming, and help keep Consonance rolling! Support the good work of IF and Consonance by attending their enormously entertaining auction, held right after the Celebration of Interfilk concert on Saturday afternoon. 
Closing Ceremony

This is our chance to thank everyone who helped make Consonance possible: the concom, the guests, and everybody here. We will give the guests gag gifts. We will sing two songs together that are special to us.

There will be a Closing Ceremony request box at the info table (labeled so that you won't confuse it with the request box for the Request Concert) where you can beg for a song you would like us all to sing at the closing ceremony. Please choose a song that can be googled so that folks who don't already know the song can listen to it ahead of time and view the lyrics on their cell phones.

The closing ceremony request box will be available Friday only, so that a performer will have time to learn the song if the songwriter is not at Consonance. We will choose one of the requested songs and announce the song on Saturday.

The second song will be "Lullaby for a Weary World", by our 2022 co-GoH TJ Burnside Clapp. Last year, it was requested for the request concert, and someone said we should sing it every year. All food will be pre-packaged to minimize the chance of spreading any spiky balls of contagion. Be sure to let the staff know if you have food allergies or sensitivities!

ALoft Rules

Please Read!

The new hotel comes with a couple of new rules of conduct.

1) Unfortunately, the hotel is concerned that we might make too much noise late at night, so they insisted on putting a clause in our contract stating that we can't filk after 1AM. We don't know if they will enforce this deadline. A similar deadline at last year's hotel wasn't enforced. In response, we're starting open filking a bit earlier. We're also getting older as a group, so this may be easier on some of us anyway.

2) No alcoholic beverages are allowed in the function space, not even the sealed bottles of beverages that turn up at Interfilk auction. Those of us who are auctioning alcoholic beverages are asked to take a photo of your item and bring that to display for the auction. Yeah, it's not the same thing as seeing a bottle of homemade liqueur, but we don't want to anger the folks who run this fine establishment ... who will fine offenders \$500. Be warned.

Child Care Policy

PARENTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR SUPERVISING THEIR CHILDREN! Young children should not be left unattended, even in the Con Suite, in the hope that Concom members or other attendees will watch over them.

Children are welcome to attend concerts and filk circles with their parents or guardians, but they must be removed if they become distracting or annoying to other people in the room. In the absence of parents, the child will be removed from the room by a Concom member and an attempt will be made to locate the parents.

COVID-19 Policy

All attendees are required to have been vaccinated against COVID. While booster shots aren't required, we highly recommend that all people who are eligible get one. If you are flying to Consonance, we highly recommend that you wear a mask at the airport and on the plane, where you are exposed to many travelers' germs.

While the local government might not be requiring masks, Consonance is requiring that all members wear masks when in the convention space or visiting the Con Suite.

Please remove them only when you are eating or drinking.

If you forgot your mask, we have some at the Information Desk. If you are running a fever or have something contagious, please stay home.


